

General Poster Information

The poster sessions will take place **August 31st to September 2nd** at the TELUS Convention Centre on the exhibit floor.

Registration

All presenters must be registered as delegates prior to July 10. Failure to register will result in your poster being removed from the program. Registration will open in December and can be accessed via:

Poster Hanging

The posters will hang for your assigned day and must be posted before your designated day before 9 am. Check in at the desk located just inside the gray exhibit entry door on the west side of the exhibit floor (sign for exhibitors only). Provide your name to the people working the desk and they will check you off the list and confirm your board number. Push pins will be provided for hanging the posters.

Poster Presentation Format and Presentations

Due to partnership with GAC, MAC and IAH this year, the poster presentation style will be different compared to previous years. **Presenters will be assigned one day for presenting their poster (August 31, September 1 or September 2);** they must be present at their poster during the morning and afternoon coffee breaks for the assigned day, plus the networking event at the end of the day (or lunch if scheduled for September 2). **Presenters are to prepare a 5-minute Mini-Oral presentation** to be delivered for the judges that will come to the poster during the coffee breaks, this year there is no assigned time to promote fluidity and conversation. Presenters are encouraged to discuss their poster and answer questions to all conference guests throughout the day.

Poster Layout

Poster display panel dimensions are 4 ft. (vertical) by 8 ft. (horizontal). **If you need two panels, please advise Breanne at the email address below before June 30.** Please make sure the poster is capable of being supported by push pins, and avoid using trifolds, banners, and wooden supports to align with the aesthetics of the conference.

Your poster should include both the title and authors of your presentation. Make the poster easy to follow in case it is viewed when you are not present. The poster should have a clear starting and ending point. Arrows or numbers should be used to define poster progression and generally should follow left to right, top to bottom rules.

Poster and Oral Presentation Selection

If you select to present an oral and poster presentation, they will be likely hosted on the same day. **If you sign up to present both, please note, you are agreeing to present both the oral (slides) presentation and the poster presentation.**
